Grant Policy for Traditional Public Schools

The Champlin Foundation's competitive grant program in the area of public secondary education focuses exclusively on classroom innovation in RI public schools. Only one application per school will be accepted, and requests will be considered for amounts up to \$100,000. Please note that any school with a prior grant that remains open is disqualified from applying until such time that the grant monies have been spent and the final Use of Funds Report has been submitted. The Champlin Foundation alternates between high schools and middle/junior high schools from year to year.

Applications must be developed around one clearly defined initiative, originating from a teacher seeking to address a critical need in a novel way. The project must promote hands-on learning in the classroom for students. Proposals containing multiple unrelated components or general needs will not be considered.

Grant requests are limited to capital items such as classroom equipment, infrastructure, and technology. Funding will be considered in the areas of art, science, English, foreign languages, mathematics, music, computer science, drama, physical education, and vocational instruction, as well as interdisciplinary initiatives. We also welcome applications related to advanced placement and honors-level courses. Please note that preference will be given to schools serving the highest percentage of economically disadvantaged students.

All online applications must have this form signed by the superintendent and principal, thereby confirming that the project has been approved by the district and the school.
